Murray & Darling River Confluence

Kinchega National Park

Home of the Menindee Lakes System

Kinchega National Park is located 200kms north of Wentworth and covers an area of approximately 443 km².

The eastern edge of the Kinchega National Park is formed by the Darling River, and the park adjoins the township of Menindee.

The park is noted for its Aboriginal artifacts, left behind by the Paakantji people, and the abundant native wild-life.

The Menindee Lakes are a series of natural lakes covering an area of 453km² adjacent to the Darling River in far western New South Wales. The amount of water in the lakes is naturally variable, filling during high flows in the Darling River and receding to form a series of pools in dry conditions. The principal lakes in the system are Menindee, Cawndilla and Pamamaroo.

Australian explorers including both Burke and Wills and Captain Charles Sturt both spent time camped at Kinchega. The campsite of Burke & Wills is signposted and clearly marked.
